Hundreds of community members from across the Brisbane CBD and Greater Brisbane footprint have been involved in the community sentiment survey we commissioned for the Queen's Wharf Brisbane project in July this year.

Brisbane-based research company Proof Research will prepare an outcomes report in the coming weeks after the last of our inception surveys were completed on Saturday 17 September. This report will help us understand what you want to hear and the best way to get it to you. But already we know Brisbane residents are keen to understand more about the free public space, and opportunities to enjoy the premium river front position come expected opening in 2022.

Destination Brisbane Consortium expects to lodge its Plan of Development for approval with Economic Development Queensland in the near future. But before any precinct work begins, extensive monitoring will occur. Monitoring will be ongoing during the adjoining building (non-heritage) demolitions and construction phase.
