

Temporary single lane closure on Margaret Street, between William and George Streets

For three (3) weeks from Monday 30 April to Monday 21 May 2018 the far-left lane of Margaret Street will be closed to enable a safe exclusion zone while excavation and shoring retention works take place along the Margaret Street site boundary.

When:

For three (3) weeks from **Monday 30 April to Monday 21 May**, the far-left lane of Margaret Street, between William and George Streets, will be closed to enable a safe exclusion zone while excavation and shoring work occurs along the Margaret Street site boundary.

Where:

The far-left lane of Margaret Street will be continuously closed between William and George Streets. See attached maps for details.

During the morning peak between 6:00am-9:30am Monday to Friday, William Street will be closed to vehicles at Margaret Street. Vehicle arrival and departure to 1 William Street will be via Alice Street during those times. William Street will be re-opened after the morning peak at 9:30am.

What to expect:

- One of the four lanes on Margaret Street, between William and George Streets will be closed continuously for three (3) weeks while work is undertaken on the site boundary
- Traffic control and signage will be in place to ensure the safety of motorists.
- For safety while the work is being undertaken, traffic control and water crash barriers will be installed in the far-left lane of Margaret Street.
- Within the construction area, heavy machinery including excavators, anchor rigs and concrete trucks will be working and will be visible to passing traffic.

Queen's Wharf Brisbane

Queen's Wharf Brisbane will be a transformational city changing project for Brisbane that will see an underutilised area of the CBD brought back to life with new purpose and exciting energy.

When complete there will be 50 restaurants, cafes and bars; a signature sky deck approximately 100 metres above William St and open to the public, five and six-star luxury hotels, the equivalent of 12 football fields of public space, world-class gaming, a new pedestrian bridge, four key retail zones and 2,000 residential apartments.

The core of the development is expected to open in 2022 with the transformation of Treasury Hotel and Casino into a high end retail centre and The Ritz-Carlton Brisbane to be complete in 2024.



During peak morning traffic times - 6:00am to 9:30am Monday to Friday

- The Riverside Expressway south and northbound Margaret Street off-ramps will remain unchanged.
- Traffic lights at the Margaret and William Street intersection will be turned off to allow the continuous flow of morning peak traffic. There will be no right turn onto William Street from Margaret Street / Gardens Point Road. William Street access and egress will be via Alice Street at this time.
- Traffic exiting Gardens Point Road onto Margaret Street will be controlled by a police officer who will ease congestion and increase traffic flow. Water barriers will also be installed for pedestrian delineation to safely cross the road at the intersection of William and Margaret Streets.
- Pedestrian access will be provided as normal along Margaret Street with a safe crossing area on William Street. See map below.

Outside weekday morning peak times (after 9:30am until 6:00am the following day) and at all times on Saturday and Sunday

- William Street will be re-opened at Margaret Street and operate as normal.
- The traffic lights and the pedestrian crossing at the Margaret Street / William Street intersection will be turned on and will function as normal.
- The Riverside Expressway southbound Margaret Street off-ramp and the Gardens Point Road exit onto Margaret Street will remain unchanged.
- The two lanes on the Riverside Expressway northbound Margaret Street off-ramp will merge.
